THE PROGRAM OBJECTIVES INCLUDE:

- Learn about a variety of career options in health care
- Learn about the educational requirements, skills, typical job duties, and personal qualities of specific health professionals and para-professionals
- Participate in interactive hands-on activities that highlight the skills, equipment, technology and resources used by health professionals.
- Increase awareness and understanding of the care setting and structure where many health professionals work.
- Students who participate in the program enjoy five days of fun and interaction on the Marshall University campus. Student who participate in the camp will receive all meals and snacks as well as a participation certificate.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

To be considered for the program, students must submit the following:

- Application Form
- Short Answer Form
- Copy of Transcript or Grade Card
- Recommendation letter from a teacher or guidance counselor

Space is limited to 25 students. A committee will review all applications.

Acceptance notification will be forwarded in early May. Students not accepted will be notified in late May.





The program will be held June 15th- 20th

Student selected will have to provide their own transportation to the camp.

Transportation will be provided to all campus sites during the camp.

The health careers covered in the camp will highlight those health sciences programs offered at Marshall University.

Students will stay in a secure residence hall on the Marshall University campus and will be accompanied by program staff at all times.

Students are required to abide by all university housing rules.

Activities will be held on Marshall University main campus, School of Medicine Campus and School of Pharmacy campus.

Upon acceptance into the Health Career Pipeline Initiative program, students will receive registration forms that are required to be completed before the student is officially registered for the program.
